MINIATURE PERPETUAL CALENDAR

SUPPLIES & TOOLS

- 4 qty. 6-in. x 12-in. Cardstock for calendar base
- \bullet 12 qty. 3/4-in. x 3-in. Cardstock for Month Titles
- 12 qty. 3 1/2-in. x 4 1/2-in. Cardstock for listing
- 12 qty. 3 1/2-in. x 5 1/2-in. Med. Vellum #30168934 for listing overlay* optional
- 1/4-in. Double Stick Tape #30013284
- Micron Pigma Pen .45MM Black #30176369 or similar
- Score Board #30193342
- Paper Trimmer #30240086
- Scissors

NOTE: For the months, you can write them in by hand or you can stamp them. In the sample shown, the months were stamped using Lawn Fawn's Claire's ABCs #30221859 and Versafine Black Ink.



1. Place the 6-in. x 12-in. cardstock onto the score board with the 12-in. edge along the top. Score at the following points: 3 3/4-in., 7 1/2-in., and 11 1/4-in.



2. Zig zag fold at the scored lines. Place two strips of double stick tape onto the 3/4-in. section of each panel. Join the panel together by overlapping one edge onto the 3/4-in. section.

For the last 3/4-in. section on the end, fold to the back and tape down.



3. Take the 3/4-in. x 3-in. strips and add the names of the months either with handwriting or stamping.




4. Optional - adding the vellum overlay

Place the vellum over the 3 1/2-in. x 4 1/2-in. pieces, aligning the 3 1/2-in edges.

Fold over 1/2-in. at the top and bottom and tape to the back.

If you have the vellum overlay, write on the vellum.



6. Finishing -

January

Stack the months and coordinating dates panel in order.

Starting with the first panel on the left and the January set, on each panel, place the month at the top and then the dates panel below, Space them out as you wish but the same for each panel to be consistent.

7. Write in names of people or special occasions like anniversaries by the appropriate date for each month.



8. You can keep the perpetual calendar folded and you can even make it into a mini album by adding decorations to make a cover behind the January panel.

Or you can display on a shelf or pin up on a board.
