BASIC ROUND SCRUBBY

SUPPLIES & TOOLS

- Scrubby Yarn
- Crochet Hook (Tip: The larger the hook, the larger the holes)
- Scissors

INSTRUCTIONS

FOR SINGLE CROCHET

Round 1: Start with the magic circle of 6 stitches. Single crochet 2 times in each stitch. You will have a total of 12 stitches when you complete the round.

Round 2: Single crochet twice into each stitch around. (24 stitches total)

Round 3: Single crochet twice into one stitch. Then one single crochet into the next. Repeat until you have 36 stitches in total.

Round 4: Single crochet twice into one stitch. Then single crochet once into the next 2 stitches. You will have a total of 48 stitches. Repeat in this pattern until you have a scrubby large enough for your needs.

FOR DOUBLE CROCHET

Round 1: Start with the magic circle of 6 stitches. Chain 2, then double crochet 2 times in each stitch. You will have a total of 12 stitches when you complete the round.

Round 2: Chain 2. Double crochet twice into each stitch around. Slip stitch to join. (24 stitches)

Round 3: Chain 2. *Double crochet twice into one stitch. Then one double crochet into the next.* Repeat from * to * around. Then slip stitch to join. (36 stitches)

Round 4: Chain 2. *Double crochet twice into one stitch. Then double crochet once into the next 2 stitches.* Repeat from * to * around. Then slip stitch to join. (48 stitches).



ADDITIONAL NOTES

- Magic Circle is not easy to learn in an instant! Practice it and watch Youtube videos until you have it down. It will make all the difference. (I recommend Crochet Guru or Berlin Crochet)
- **Single Crochet:** Push through the stitch on the previous row with your crochet hook. Yarn over and pull the yarn through the first loop on your hook only. Yarn over again and pull through the two stitches on your hook. You should have only 1 loop on your hook when you finish your single crochet.
- **Double Crochet:** Yarn over, then push through the stitch on the previous row. Yarn over and pull the yarn through the first two stitches on your hook only. Yarn over again and pull through the remaining two stitches on your hook. You should have only one loop on your hook when you finish your double crochet. Don't forget that the Double is a much taller stitch, and that you must chain 2 or 3 before beginning a row to match the height of the double crochet.
