



UPCYCLED BOTTLE BUNNY

SUPPLIES & TOOLS

- 2-liter bottle - empty, clean and dry
- Americana Multi surface Satin paint - Cotton Ball white #30141038
- Ceramcoat Lost Lagoon blue #30201096 for the eyes
- Ceramcoat Fuchsia pink #77630160 for the nose and inner ears
- Artist Sponge #30159839
- Small paintbrush
- Black Sharpie Marker #91029- for outlines and whiskers
- Scissors
- Scratch paper and pen/pencil

NOTE: Adults may want to do the cutting of the plastic bottle for younger children.



INSTRUCTIONS



1. Cut the top off the bottle as close to the top as you can if you want long ears.



2. Sketch a bunny face and ears on scratch paper and place inside of the bottle.



3. Use a marker to trace the bunny face and ears on the outside of the bottle, including the top edge. Cut around the markings on the bottle. Check and trim off any uneven areas that may snag or poke you later. If there are still marker lines, you can remove them using rubbing alcohol.



4. Sponge paint the bunny bottle. You can paint it on the outside or from the inside. Your choice, it all depends on what you want to use it for. Let dry.



5. Paint and or draw in the bunny details like the eyes, nose and whiskers. You can also paint the insides of the ears. Let dry.



6. You can fill the bunny with treats. Or make holes at the bottom and use it as a planter.

There are many uses for this upcycled container. Use your imagination and create other animals or characters.
