



# HEARTY CLAY - CABBAGE BUNNY

## SUPPLIES & TOOLS

- White Hearty Clay #30006454
- Green Hearty Clay #30030919
- Pink Hearty Clay #30201873 or Pink Acrylic Paint #30153002
- Paper towels
- Tacky Glue #1360916
- Paintbrush if using paint

**NOTE:** To prevent the Hearty clay from drying out, store your unused Hearty Clay by pushing out all the air from the package, sealing package and wrapping tightly with clear wrap. Then, place into an airtight container.



## INSTRUCTIONS



1. Mix a small (blueberry -sized) ball of green Hearty clay with 1.5-inch sized ball of white clay to get a green color.

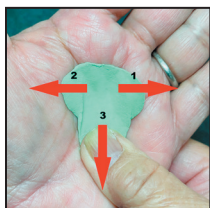
Take half of the ball and add to another 1-inch sized ball of white Hearty clay to create a lighter shade of green.

Repeat if you want to create more lighter shades of green.



2. Take the darkest shade of green clay and divide into 6 pieces. Shape into teardrop shaped cones.

Place the teardrop shape onto the palm of your left hand, with the wider side at the top.



3. With your other hand, use your thumb to spread the clay to the right, then left. Then, straight down into leaf/petal shape. Make the clay as thin as possible. Peel the petal off your palm. The side with the texture from your palm print is the right side up. Set aside.

Continue making more leaves/petals in smaller sizes with the other shades of greens.



4. **Cabbage** - This is like making an open rose flower. Place three petals of the darkest green together, joining at the center.

Fold a piece of paper towel into a ring shape to rest the piece onto to keep its shape.



5. Layer the next three petals, placing them in between the first layer.

Add a few more layers, using the lighter shades of green, until it looks like a head of cabbage.



6. **Bunny** - the bunny will look like it is leaping into the center of the cabbage. Refer to the pictured sample for placement.

**Body** - take the white Hearty clay and rollout a 1.5-inch ball. Slightly flatten to make it more oval shaped. Place in the center of the cabbage. Roll out a tiny white ball and place on the lower half for the tail.



7. **Bunny** -  
**Feet** - Take two 1/2-inch balls of white clay. Shape into rounded flat teardrops. Place a foot on either side at the body of the body.

**Ears** - Take two 3/4-inch balls of white clay. Roll each piece into long teardrops for the ears. Place the ears into the cabbage at the top of the body, as shown.

Leave the piece in the paper towel as it air dries.



8. **Finishing** -  
For the foot details, you can paint them on with pink acrylic paint or use small bits of pink hearty clay.

You can trim off excess clay at the bottom to make the piece lay flat. This will make it easier to add a pinback or to glue it onto a jar top of frame.

Use a little Tacky glue to re-attach any piece that hasn't completely adhered after drying.
