





SUPPLIES & TOOLS

- 8 in. x 8 in. Cardstock or medium weight paper solid color bunny head
- 3 in. x 4-1/2 in. Cardstock/med. Weight paper matching color ears
- Black Fine Tip Marker (Sharpie)
- Pink Colored Pencil Cheeks
- 6 8 in. of ribbon for bow

Optional items:

Tacky Glue or Double Stick Tape Paper Folder Tool

NOTE: You can make the bunny any size by changing the size of the square paper. You can also use the same fold to make a basket. The sample used a 12 in. x 12 in. cardstock to make the basket the bunny sits in. Smaller bunny was made with 6 in. x 6 in. square.



INSTRUCTIONS



1. Place the square paper on point in front of you. Fold the bottom point to the top point, creating a triangle. Crease well.


4. Take just the top

layer point and fold


down and tuck into

the folded over layer.


Crease the fold well.



2. Take the bottom right point and fold it up to the left edge, making a straight edge going across the piece. Crease well.



5. Flip the piece over to the smooth side of the basket for the bunny's face. Turn the piece upside down so that the shorter edge is on the top.



3. Bring the bottom left point to the right edge, matching the first layer's straight edge going across. Crease well.



6. Use the marker to draw in the eyes, nose, mouth and whiskers. Use the pink colored pencil to color in the cheeks on both sides of the nose.



8. Place the ears at the top and tuck the bottom into the folds on the back of the face. Add tape to secure if needed.




7. Fold the 3 in. x 4-1/2 in. cardstock in half lengthwise. Place the ear pattern on the fold and trace and cut out ears.

Optional for the inner ears - Cut smaller patterned paper and glue in place. Or, use the pink pencil to color in the insides of the ears.



9. Squeeze open the bottom and place a few small wrapped treats inside.



10. Fold over the remaining pointed flap and tuck into the "pocket' to close the bottom.

Depending on how much you leave of the flap at the bottom, the bunny may be able to stand the up.



11. You can add on to the bunny a bow, flowers or other embellishments.

You can also make a larger basket with a 12 in. x 12 in. printed paper and tuck the bunny in with some grass and other treats.



12. EXTRA - Here are bunnies made with

6 in. x 6 in. cardstock and using the smaller ear pattern. Moving eyes and patterned paper for the inner ears.
