BOYS DAY FISH TREAT BOX

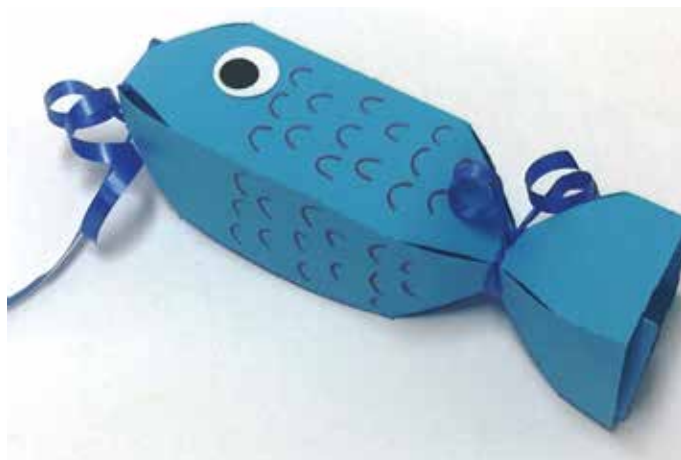
SUPPLIES

- Candy Box Die Cut (8.5 in. x 11 in. cardstock)*
- 2 in. x 2 in. White Cardstock for eyes
- Black Sharpie Marker
- Markers or Crayons for coloring "scales"
- 1/4 in. Double-stick Tape or glue dots for the eyes
- 8 in. Curling Ribbon for tail
- 24 in. Curling Ribbon for hanger

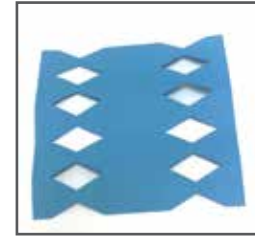
NOTE: To make the Candy Box die cut - Take a sheet of cardstock and use the Ben Franklin store AccuCut machine and the Candy Box die for free or use the WeR Candy Box Punch Board if you have one.

TOOLS

- Scissors
- 5/8 in. or 3/4 in. Circle Punch



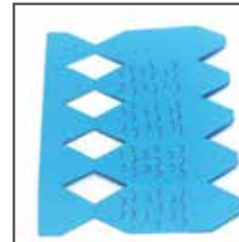
INSTRUCTIONS



1. Cut out one Candy Box shape with your own WeR Candy Box Punch Board or from our Accu Cut Die Cut machine in the stores. *See store for details.



2. Fold under one of the side flaps on the box. This end will be the fish's face.



3. Use markers or crayons and draw the fish scales on four of the middle sections. You can leave one of the end sections uncolored since it will be covered.



4. Fold up the box and tuck the uncolored section into the other end section.



5. Take the 24" of curling ribbon; leave a 4" tail and feed through the top of the folded over sections, like a drawstring.



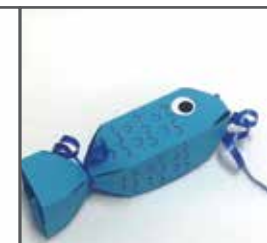
6. Tie the ribbon ends together and curl the tail end of the ribbon. The longer end of the ribbon can be used to hang the fish up for display.



7. At the other open end, fill the box with treats.



8. Gently push in at the perforated lines to the center and tie together with the 8" piece of curling ribbon. This is the fish tail.



9. For the eyes, punch out two 5/8" circles from white cardstock and color in the pupils with the black Sharpie marker. Use the double stick tape to glue to the fish on the head side of the fish as shown.
