

TRIPLE EASEL CARD

SUPPLIES & TOOLS

- 10-in. x 5-in. Cardstock A - Lg. Easel Base
- 5-in x 5-in. Cardstock A - Lg. Easel Front
- 8-in. x 4-in Cardstock B - Med. Easel Base
- 4-in. x 4-in. Cardstock B - Med. Easel Front
- 6-in x 3-in Cardstock C - Sm. Easel Base
- 3-in. x 3-in. Cardstock C - Sm. Easel Front
- 2 qty. - 4 3/4-in. x 4 3/4-in. Printed/Solid Cardstock Mat for Lg. Easel
- 2 qty. - 3 3/4-in. x 3 3/4-in. Printed/Solid Cardstock Mat for Med. Easel
- 2 qty. - 2 3/4-in. x 2 3/4-in. Printed/Solid Cardstock Mat for Sm. Easel
- Embellishments - die cuts, stickers, stamped images, etc.
- 1/4-in. Double Stick Tape #30013284
- Foam Pop Up Glue Dots #30008288
- Paper Trimmer #30088131
- Score Board #30195075
- Scissors

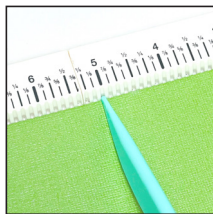
Optional:

- Ruler and pencil
- 5-in. x 7-in. Envelope

NOTE: Cardstock A, B and C can be all the same as in the sample or three different ones. This card will fit in a 5x7 envelope if the embellishments do not extend over the top of the largest layer. Solid or printed cardstock can be used for Color A, B and C.

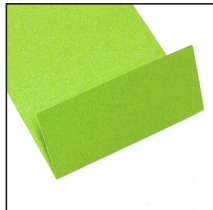


INSTRUCTIONS

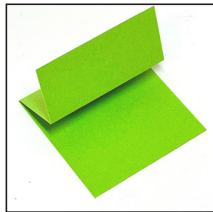


1. Place each of the Easel Base Cardstocks A, B and C on the score board with the long edge along the top edge of the score board. Score at the following points:

Color A 5 x 10: Score at 2 1/2-inch and 5-inch.
Color B 4 x 8: Score at 2-inch and 4-inch.
Color C 3 x 6: Score at 1 1/2-inch and 3-inch.

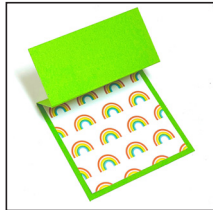


2. On all three cardstock base pieces, fold up and crease the first scored line from the edge.



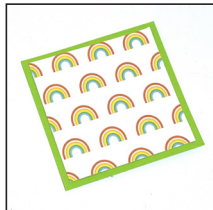
3. Next, fold down and crease the mid-point scored line on all three base pieces.

Set aside for now.



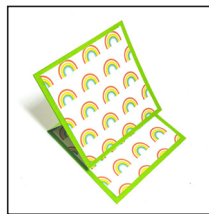
4. Take one Small Mat cardstock piece and center onto the large square section of the Small Easel Base. Attach with tape.

Repeat for the other two easel bases.

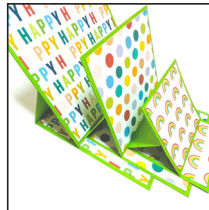


5. Take the other Small Mat cardstock piece and center onto the Small Easel Front cardstock. Attach with tape.

Repeat for the other two Easel Front cardstocks.



6. Attach the Easel Front to the Easel Base. Align the top edge to the edge of the first creased line fold (from step 3).



7. Line up the easels starting with the Largest at the back. Center each one on top of the other's matted base section.

The Large Easel will be propped up by the Medium Easel. The Medium Easel will be propped up by the Small Easel.

Carefully, attach the easels together by taping the bottoms onto the bases.



8. You will need one embellishment for the front of the Small easel base to keep it propped up when the card is on display. Adjust the easel angle and then adhere the embellishment to the base in front. Using a foam pop dot to attach makes it hold the easel up better.



9. Embellish the easels with different decorations like cut-outs, stickers or stamped images.

Keep in mind that how far you extend embellishments from the card edges as well as the thickness will affect if it can easily fit in an envelope.



10. Close the card by lowering each easel flat starting with the smallest. Each easel section will close over the smaller one.

NOTE: If you think your recipient won't know how to display the card, add a post-it note to explain that they can prop each section up.
