



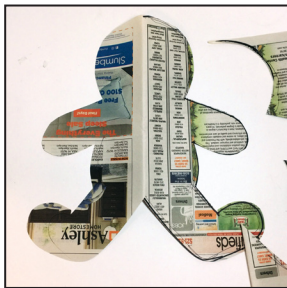
# PAPER GINGERBREAD COOKIE

## SUPPLIES & TOOLS

- Brown Kraft Wrapping Paper #77568253, Paper Bags or similar
- Newspaper for making pattern
- Fiberfil or old newspaper for stuffing #77479709
- Ceramcoat White Acrylic Paint #77624882 for “icing”
- Ceramcoat Black Acrylic Paint #77624890 for eyes
- Ceramcoat Bright Red Acrylic Paint #77624866 for “buttons”
- Pencil/Pen for drawing pattern
- Scissors
- Paintbrush
- Low Temp glue Gun & Glue Sticks
- Ribbon, Raffia, Yarn/Twine for Bow
- Embellishments - buttons, jingle bells, floral picks



## INSTRUCTIONS



1. Use a sheet of newspaper or similar to draw a pattern template of your gingerbread person.

TIP: Larger gingerbread people will be easier to stuff because there will be more room and a larger opening.



4. Carefully stuff the gingerbread person with fiberfill or crumpled up paper. Do not overstuff!

Glue the opening closed. Check to see if any of the edges popped open while you were stuffing the piece. Glue those areas closed.

NOTE: If you want to hang your gingerbread cookie up, glue a looped ribbon between the two layers at the top of the head.



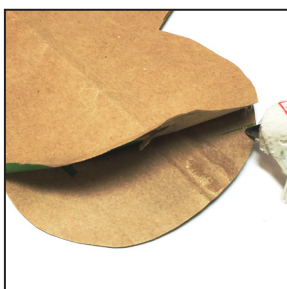
2. Trace and cut out two gingerbread people from brown paper or similar.

If you use newspaper, you can paint the newspaper with brown acrylic paint.



5. Decorate! Use the white paint to make “icing” lines around the gingerbread cookie. Paint eyes or glue on moving eyes.

Use the red paint to make “buttons” down the middle of the body. Tie a bow around the neck to finish. Add floral picks or jingle bells to the bow.



3. Place the two gingerbread pieces together and glue along the edges but leave at least a 2-inch opening at the top of the head.



6. Place the finished decorated cookie on a wreath, in the Christmas tree or just hang up as is for a decoration.
