



PAPER PUMPKIN

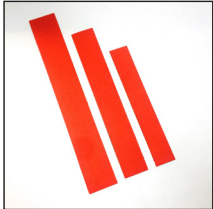
SUPPLIES & TOOLS

- 2 qty. 12" x 12" Cardstock – Pumpkin colors – orange, yellow, greens
- Cardstock – Green for leaves
- 1.5" x 3" Cardstock – Brown for stem
- 1/4-in. Double Stick Tape #30013284
- WE R Score Board #30193342
- Low Temp Glue Gun & Glue Sticks
- Paper Trimmer #30174692
- Scissors
- 1" Circle Punch #30028719 (or trace a quarter)
- Chopstick, thin paintbrush handle or similar for coiling paper

NOTE: You can also use other colors instead of orange like yellow, greens and gold and have an assortment of pumpkins.



INSTRUCTIONS



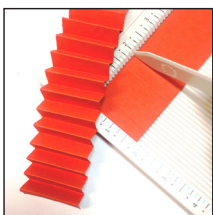
1) Cut the orange cardstock for the pumpkin into these size strips:

- 1 qty. - 1.25" x 8"
- 2 qty. - 1.5" x 10"
- 2 qty. - 1.75" x 12"



5) Stack and glue the medallions together in this order, bottom to top:

- 1.5"
- 1.75"
- 1.75"
- 1.5"
- 1.25" with green circle on top

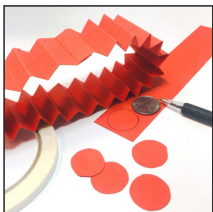


2) Accordion fan fold each strip using 1/2" increments.

TIP: Use a Score Board to score 1/2" increments across the strips. It helps to make the accordion folds easier.

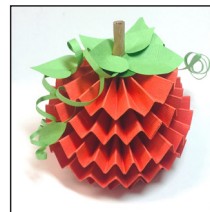


6) Cut a few skinny strips from the green cardstock and curl around a chopstick, paintbrush or similar for vines. Cut a few leaves from the green.



3) Take two matching length strips and tape together to make one circle. Overlap the ends and use double stick tape.

Punch two 1" circles from orange cardstock for each medallion set. Cut one green circle for the 1.25" medallion top and punch a 1/4" hole in the center.



7) Roll the brown cardstock strip and glue the end so it won't unravel. Glue this to the top for the pumpkin stem, placing it in the center hole of the green circle. Glue the vines around the stem. Glue the leaves around the stems.



4) Gather each circle and flatten into a medallion. Carefully add some hot glue to the center of a 1" circle and glue onto the center of the medallion. Glue another 1" circle to the center on the other side. These circles help keep the medallion together.

Use your pumpkin as is for a decoration or add a coiled wire to the stem for a photo holder.
