



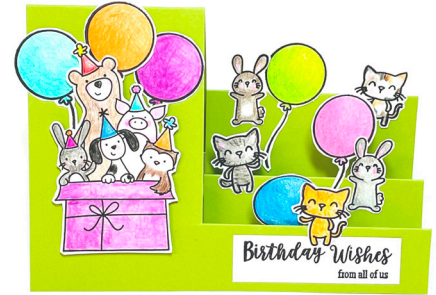
SIDE STEP CARD

SUPPLIES & TOOLS

- 7 in. x 10 in. Cardstock – card base
- Score Board #30195075
- Paper Trimmer #30174692
- Embellishments – stamped images, stickers, additional cardstock for layering, buttons, etc.
- Double-stick Tape #30013284
- Aleene’s Fast Grab Tacky Glue #30172710
- Scissors
- 5 in. x 7 in. Card Envelope

NOTE: If using printed cardstock, keep in mind the direction of the print and how it will appear on the final card design.

This 5 in. x 7 in. card size gives you room to add a small pocket behind the left 3 in. section that you can slip in a gift card.



INSTRUCTIONS

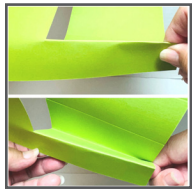


1. Place the cardstock onto the paper trimmer with the 7-inch edge along the top. Line up the left edge at the 3-inch mark.

Place the trimmer blade at the 1-1/4 in. mark on the cutting guide, cut to the 7-3/4 in. mark, creating a slit.



3. Now score the 3 in. section at the 5 in. mark. Score only from the edge to the slit

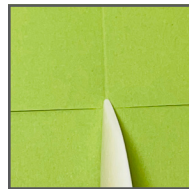


5. On the right side or 4 in. section. fold the scored lines like an accordion. Starting with the first 1-1/4 in. scored line, fold the section down. This creates a peak or “mountain” fold at the scored line.

Next, at the second scored line, crease the fold bringing the sides together. This creates a “valley”.



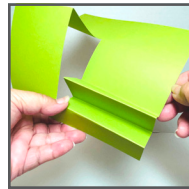
7. After the last fold, you will end up with the card base having a three-tiered folded section on the right



2. Place the cardstock onto the Score Board with the 10 in. edge along the top and the 4 in. section topside. The first and last lines to score match where the slit starts and ends. Align the cardstock to match and score at the following marks: 1-1/4 in., 2-1/2 in., 4 in., 5-1/2 in. and 7-3/4 in.



4. Start folding the card – On the left 3 in. side of the card base, fold down at the 5 in. scored line.



6. Continue the accordion folding with the rest of the scored lines.



8. Embellish the card as desired. Because of the tiered layers, you can add a lot of dimension to the card. The card is great for displaying. If you keep the embellishments below the height of the top left edge, you will be able to place the card in a standard envelope.
