## Supplies:

White Hearty Clay #3000 6454  
Orange Hearty Clay #30030918  
Brown Hearty Clay #3001 6915  
Light Green Hearty Clay #3003 0919  
Hearty Clay Color Scale tool #7785 6054  
Tacky Glue #7760 9875  
Pin back #7712 6587 or #7740 3337  
Low temp glue gun & glue sticks  
Toothpick or needle tool  
*Optional* – Mini Fern Roping #3002 6586

## Directions:

Using the Hearty Clay Color Scale tool measure out an “H” ball of white clay. To make the large mochi on the bottom, slightly squeeze the ball to flatten to about 3/8” thick. Flatten the bottom end and leave the topside curved. For the top mochi, measure out a “G” ball of white clay. Slightly squeeze to flatten and shape as the first ball. Place the top mochi onto the bottom mochi; use a little tacky glue if necessary.

For the tangerine, measure out an “F” ball of orange clay. Roll into a ball then slightly flatten to get the tangerine shape. Use a toothpick or needle tool to make a small hole in the center top.

Roll a small piece of brown clay into a thin log. Place a small bit of tacky glue in the hole and slip the brown clay in. Cut off the clay leaving only a 1/4” stem. Measure out an “A” ball of light green clay. Flatten and pinch both ends to form a leaf. Make a slight indentation line in the middle of the leaf. Glue leaf next to the stem. Glue tangerine on top of the mochi stack.

Measure out an “H” ball of brown clay. Roll into a log about 1-1/4” long. Square off all of the sides of the log to make the stand. Center and glue the mochi stack onto the stand. Measure out two “C” balls of brown clay. Roll into balls and glue to either end on the bottom of the stand.

**Optional:** you can add small fern leaves below the mochi stack before gluing together.

Glue pin back behind the mochi stack on the flat side.
