



YEAR OF THE OX FAVOR BOX

MATERIALS & TOOLS

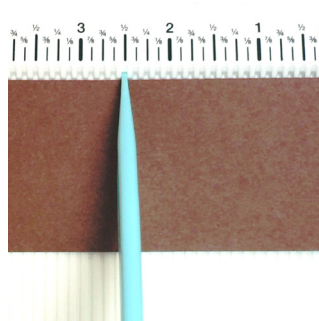
- 1 qty. 2 1/4" x 8" Brown Cardstock - Favor box portion
- 2 qty. 4 1/2" x 4 1/2" Brown Cardstock - Ox Head
- 2 qty. 2" x 2" Brown cardstock - Ears
- 2 qty. 2 1/2" x 3" White Cardstock - Horns
- 2 qty. 1 1/2" x 1 1/2" White Cardstock - Eyes
- 1 qty. 2" x 3" Lt. Brown Cardstock - Muzzle
- 1 qty. 1" x 1" Lt. Brown Cardstock - Hair Tuft
- Black Sharpie Marker
- Ribbon for bow
- 1/4" Meriken Double Stick Tape #30013284
- Scissors
- Paper Score Board #30195075
- Pencil for tracing



INSTRUCTIONS



1) Take the two 4 1/2" brown cardstock pieces and trace and cut out two 4" circles. For a 4" circle template, you can trace around something like a ribbon roll or print out a circle from your computer to make a template. Set aside.



2) Take the 2 1/4" x 8" brown cardstock strip and place lengthwise along the top of the score board. Score at the 2 1/2" and 5 1/2" marks.

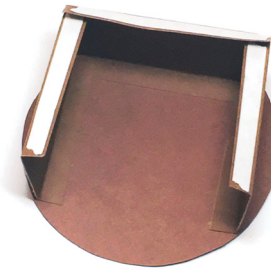


3) Rotate the strip. Score at 3/8" and 1 7/8".

INSTRUCTIONS (Continued)



4) Crease and fold along all scored lines. Snip at 2 1/2" and 5 1/2" where they intersect with the 3/8" sections. Place double stick tape along the 3/8" sections.



5) Fold up the strip at the 2 1/2" and 5 1/2" lines so it looks like a "U" and adhere to a 4" circle as shown. Repeat with the other circle on the other side. This creates the Ox Box.



6) **Add the Ox details:**
 - Cut two rounded triangles from brown for the ears and glue behind the back at the top of the head.
 - Cut out two curved pieces from white for the horns and glue to the back of the ears.
 - Cut out two 1" (or quarter sized) white circles and glue to the top third for the eyes. Use the black marker to color in the eyes.
 - Cut out a 2 1/2" oval in the light brown for the muzzle. Glue below the eyes. Use the black marker to draw in the nostrils.
 - Take a scrap from the light brown cardstock to make a hair tuft at the top of the head.



7) Tie a bow and glue at the bottom below the mouth. The bow can also help keep the box from rolling around. Fill the with treats!
